Curator Emeritus

H. Parrott Bacot, Jr. honored at Forum

In the 1960s, the Friends asked H. Parrott Bacot, Ir., then director of LSU's Anglo-American Art Museum, to guide them in the accurate late 1820s recreation of the interiors of Magnolia Mound, a French Creole plantation house. As a volunteer advisor and curator, Bacot led the restoration work with exacting standards of accuracy. His tireless devotion and expertise through the years has made Magnolia Mound one of the finest house museums in our area.

After many decades Pat is stepping down as Magnolia Mound's curator emeritus. We will miss his invaluable assistance and cannot thank him enough.



Inside Magnolia Mound Arrives

At long last, *Inside Magnolia Mound*, a handsome 28-page color publication, has arrived.

Available for sale at the Turner Family Visitor Center Gift Shop, the new booklet features glorious photographs of the historic house and the collection. Designed for visitors, it contains a floor plan,



and a brief essay and overview of each room's significant items in the Friends of Magnolia Mound decorative arts collection.

The publication celebrates the 50th Anniversary of the saving of the Mound and was entirely underwritten by George and Ruth Rosenthal Bilbe in memory of Elise Cohn and Robert M. Rosenthal. Photography by Jim Zeitz was underwritten by the descendants of James Hillen, the first owner of Magnolia Mound. The publication also honors the many donors of items to the Friends' Collection.

Come See Leon and Caroline Back Home at Magnolia Mound!



The portraits of Leon and Caroline Bonnecaze on display in the Salon.


The Salon once again features the fine portraits of Leon Bonnecaze (1797-1872) and his wife, Caroline Mahier (1803-1888). These pendants (created as a pair to face each other) were painted by Louis-Antoine Collas in 1824. Leon was a native of France and was the French Consul in Baton Rouge. He helped welcome the Marquis de Lafayette to Baton Rouge in 1825. The Hilton Hotel now sits on the site where their home stood on Lafayette Street. Leon and Caroline were friends of the Duplantiers, and later, the George Hall family who lived at Magnolia Mound. The portraits descended to Miss Blanche Duncan, a Bonnecaze descendant, who owned Magnolia Mound from 1929-1958.

The portraits were given to the Friends by Mrs. Shirley Jarreau Dunbar, in memory of her husband, Winder Hart Dunbar. The Dunbar Family were honored for their generous gift at the Hart House Dedication on October 28, 2019.

NEWS FROM THE MUSEUM DIRECTOR

The Covid-19 crisis required that Magnolia Mound close to all visitors on Tuesday, March 17, 2020. Full-time staff continued to work each day, on site and remotely from home. Staff is taking this time to catch up on delayed maintenance and accomplish several important "rainy day items." Tour guides have been using "on-line" training resources to complete important training programs. Education staff has been expanding our on-line resources for students and teachers.



Christopher Triche, exhibit coordinator and archivist, has been called to serve with the Louisiana National Guard. A reservist, Triche is a medic, and is helping to administer Covid-19 tests in New Orleans. Magnolia Mound and BREC are very proud of Christopher.

This summer would have been our 40th year of Summer History Camp. We had planned to celebrate this historic date with special events and promotions. (Winnie Byrd started that first camp, and our new board member, Susan Eaton was the first counselor.) Our education staff is exploring several options to have a safe version of our summer camp. Those alternative plans are still evolving.

Magnolia Mound staff, working with BREC's Communications Department, has produced several short video segments for social media about the site's history. Magnolia Mound's website and our Facebook page have shown increased traffic to view our updated information, and visitors wanting a special "virtual" experience.

Magnolia Mound plans to re-open to the public for grounds tours on Friday, May 15, 2020, and will phase in small tours of the historic house beginning in June.
